

Skinny



The breed characteristics of a Skinny is its hairless body and Coarse coated head, legs and feet. Presented with wellgroomed skin, which appears to be well looked after, without being shaved or showing the use of types of hair removal products.

Standard

1. Body and shape	20

4. Coat distribution

There should be coat on the head, on feet/toes and on legs. They should have round shaped coat on the muzle and bridge of the nose, it is allowed for the coat to strive up to the ears in the shape of an V. With this come a hairsless forehead between the coat that runs The legs should be covered in coat up to the elbow/knee. Coat around genitals are preferred.

5. Coat texture and density

The quality of the coat should be coarse, dense and crispy. The coat is of normal length, comparable with the length of other show coated breeds.

6. Skin

The skin of a skinny should be clean, elastic, smooth, warm to touch and without scars. There should be significant folds in the skin around neck and above the legs.

Faults

- Slightly short, long and/or thin coat on head, feet/toes.
- Coat on jaws and/or patches of coat on the body.
- Slightly soft and/or straight coat
- Slightly dry, scurvy, oily and/or unelastic skin or some scars.
- many pigment spots

Disqualifications

- Too short, long, thin and/or missing coat on head, feet/toes.
- Too soft and/or straight coat
- too much coat on the body
- too many scars or deviations in skin
